No. 1111-E.—In exercise of the powers conferred on him by Section 147-A (c) of the Central Provinces Land Revenue Act, 1881, as amended by the Central Provinces Land Revenue Act, 1889, the Chief Commissioner is pleased to make the following additions and amendments to the rules regarding the duties of village watchmen which were published in Notification No. 4932, dated the 10th August 1891:—

In Rule 12 (V) in clause (c) after the words "hear the village" add the words "or any offence punishable under Sections 143-144, 145, 147 or 14 of the Indian Penal code"

Add the following clauses:

- "(d) the departure from his home of any convict whose name has been entered in the Police Surveillance Register, together with his destination (if known)."
- "(e) the advent in his village of any suspicious stranger together with any information which can be obtained from questioning him regarding his antecedents and place of residence."

At the beginning of the last clause of this rule for "(d)" substitute "(f)."
