S. O. 2334—Whereas by a notification of the Government of India in the Department of Culture (Archaeological Survey of India) S.O. No. 3435 dated the 2nd December, 1987, published in Part II, Section 3, sub-section 3 of the Gazette of India dated the 12th December 1987 the Central Government gave two month's notice of intention to declare the monuments specified in the Schedule to the said notification to be of national importance and a copy of the said notification was affixed in a conspicuous place near the said monuments as required by section (1) of section 4 of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Sites and Remains Act, 1958 (24 of 1958)

And whereas, the said Gazette was made available to the public on the 14th December, 1987 :

And whereas, no objection from the public has been received by the Central Government :

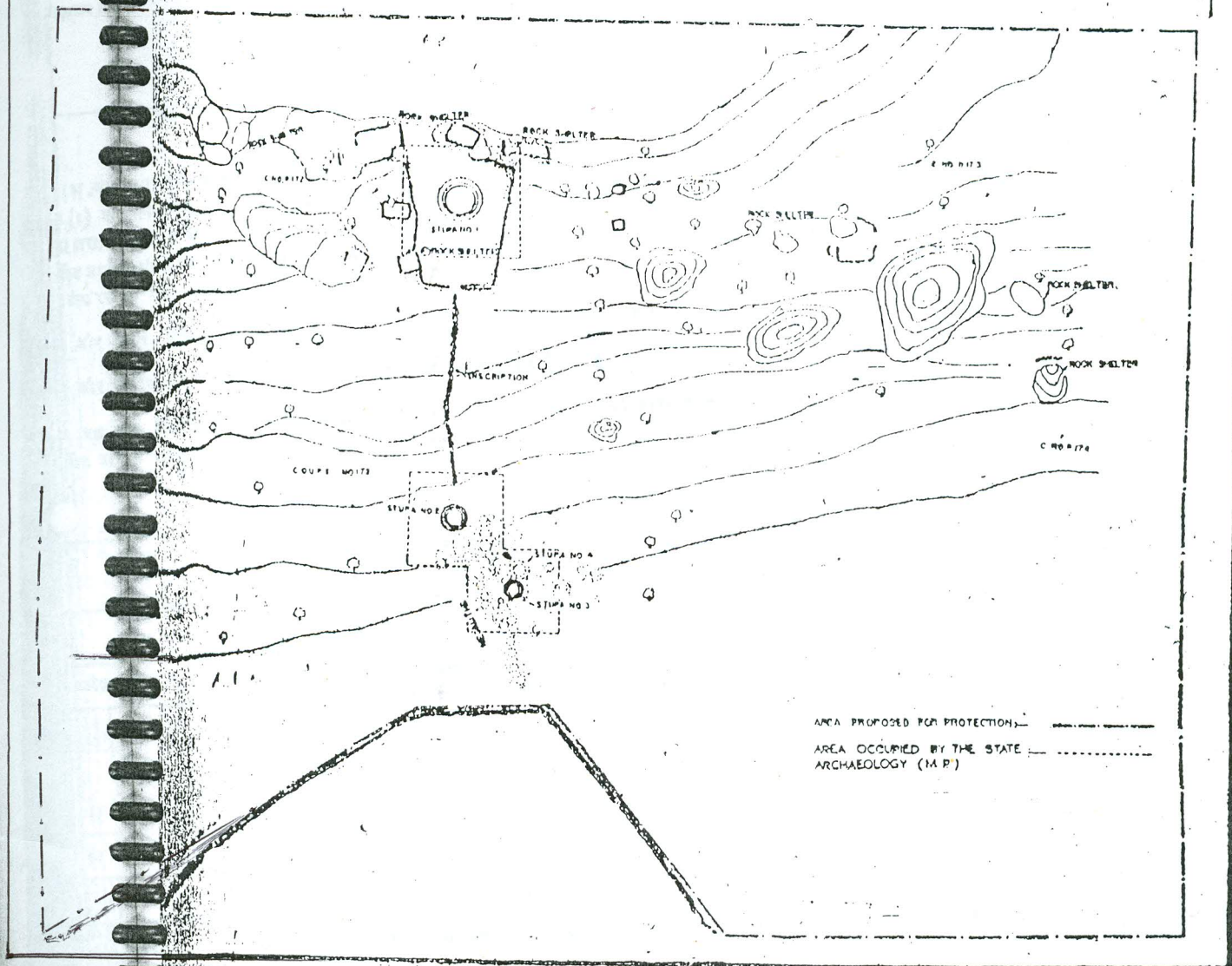
Now, therefore in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section 3 of section 4 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby declares the ancient monuments specified in the Schedule annexed hereto to be national monuments.
